

Training and Work Pathways Program (TWPP)

A grant program jointly delivered by Skills Tasmania and Jobs Tasmania.

There are two streams for 2024, aimed at supporting better job and training outcomes for Tasmanians facing disadvantage.

Stream 1 – Skills Tasmania



Pathways to training and employment Aimed at supporting disadvantaged learners from traditional TWPP cohorts to a successful training or employment outcome.

Stream 2 – Jobs Tasmania



Youth Support

Aimed at supporting young people aged, 15 to 25 years, who are disengaged or at risk of disengagement, and/or are more vulnerable to experiencing disadvantage.



Training and Work Pathways Program Stream 1

Pathways to training and employment

Projects funded under this stream must undertake targeted activities that address specific barriers or disadvantage impacting people accessing and participating in training and/or employment that:

- increases participation in training and leads to better labour force participation, work-readiness or employment outcomes for Tasmanians facing disadvantage, and/or
- supports collaborative relationships between community organisations, training providers and employers to increase access to and supported participation in training and/or employment for Tasmanians facing disadvantage.

Stream 1 Who is eligible to apply?

A community service, notfor profit organisation, club or community-based

A charity, a trust that is an incorporated body and under a formal arrangement a with community service organization.

A business or employer, including Group Training Organisations and Regional Jobs Hubs.

A Skills Tasmania Endorsed Registered Training Organisation

What types of projects can be funded?


The program supports projects that clearly address disadvantages to engagement in training and/ or employment faced by specific Tasmanian groups.



Type 01

Supported work readiness, foundation and/ or entry level non-nationally recognized training.

Type 02

Supported work exposure and placement.



Type 03

Trialling new strategies or initiatives to support access to training or a pathway to work.

Each criteria for Stream 1 is equally weighted.

Tasmanian Government Training and Work Pathways Program Stream 2

- Focus on young people (15-25 years) who are disengaged or at risk of disengagement, and/or more vulnerable to experience disadvantage and/or complex barriers to employment, education or training.
- The program will support eligible organisations to provide individualised and wrap-around support for young people to engage in a pathway to work, education or training over longer term (up to) two-year projects.
- Includes a focus on young people experiencing unstable housing or are at risk of homelessness.
- Demonstrated collaboration with other parts of the Tasmanian EET eco-system, health and social services supports are a crucial expectation.
- Total pool of \$1.2 million, allocated across three regions (\$400,000 across each region)

Stream 2 Who is eligible to apply?

Your organisation must have an Australian Business Number (ABN), and be operating in Tasmania at the time of application.

Sole trader, partnership, company, trust or incorporated organisation



Charity registered with the ACNC

Lead organisation, as a legal entity, acting on behalf of consortia of businesses or community organisations

Be able to commence delivery of the activity withing three months of execution of a Grant Deed



Assessment Criteria Stream 2 – Youth Support

There are 5 assessment criteria for Stream 2:

01

Sound organisational governance and capability

02 Experience in delivering services to young people and achieving wellbeing, employment and education outcomes

03

Ability to deliver youth services and achieve the intended outcomes

04

Demonstrated capacity to work with employers, community-based organisations and schools to create employment and education opportunities in the local community

05

Budget breakdown and project value

Address all assessment criteria and attach the required templates and evidence Check the 2024 TWPP Stream 1 **OR** Stream 2 Guidelines for all conditions and assessment criteria



Tips for writing an application

01

Read the Guidelines before you start your application!

04

Ensure that you have attached all the required information – if not your applications may not be eligible.

07

Provide <u>evidence</u> to support claims.

02

Keep goals, such as number of participants, realistic and achievable.

05

Fill in all the questions on the application.

08

Ensure that the project involves training and/ or employment services/ support.

03

Ensure OUTPUTS and OUTCOMES are clear, realistic and achievable.

06

Ensure that the budget, risk and project plan are all well developed and clear.



Provide evidence of your capacity to undertake the project.
